Four Counties

So, 2025 saw the Four Counties being played at Thetford, hosted by Norfolk at the same venue we visited in 2021. This is always a challenging course with some extremely long par 4's and when there is a strong wind as we experience this year even the bigger hitters were struggling to hit the greens in regulation. Thetford as a course has experienced the same weather patterns as we have this season which meant whilst the greens and tee boxes looked good the fairways were struggling to recover. Sadly, due to the lack of any fairway definition the decision was made by the hosts not to play preferred lies and that made a big difference as a great shot was often not rewarded with a great lie and chipping was interesting as well as challenging!

After a good showing in the Triangular earlier in the year the team had high hopes with several of the players from last year's away fixture at Droitwich playing, when as a team we averaged 40.2 points. Maybe we were over optimistic as the wind blew; although we did manage a full round in sunshine which has been a challenge recently, the course and conditions just proved tricky. Whilst Norfolk, Buckinghamshire and Worcestershire all to some extent seemed to master the course collectively as a team we seemed to be second best this year with no disasters but no really good scores. As always, the company and camaraderie were excellent and a decent meal after the golf ensured the conversations flowed. Well, it has been a long time, 2014 in fact since Norfolk had won this event but with home advantage and some great scores including one fourball with 45 points they came out on top by a country mile with 207 points for their best 5 scores. That left Worcestershire, last year's winners on 186 points, followed by Buckinghamshire on 183, and sadly Hertfordshire a distant fourth with 173 points. So, congratulations to Norfolk on a fine win, now the holders of the J.E.S. Teddy Brookes Trophy. Next year we will hope to do much better, especially as we are due to host the event at Brookman's Park, a course we all know well.

As the Captains welcomed everyone and the results were declared it soon became apparent that Hertfordshire's recent run of poor results in matches was going to be continued. So, the overall result was $6 \frac{1}{2}$ to $3 \frac{1}{2}$ to Essex, but with Henry Appiah a member of both societies playing for Essex, we could have claimed a half point in that match!

So, congratulations to Captain Brian Sparks and Essex, the holders of the new trophy and we must look at our selection criteria for next season when we are due to renew the battle at Maylands Golf Club on the 13th of August.
